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


## Academic performance between boys and girls

- **Extensively studied in a variety of ways and disciplines.**
- \* Findings very often tend to blame either the biological factor or the sociological factor:
  - > Biological factor: boys and girls differ in brain structures, functionality, and regions of the brain.
  - Sociological factor: parents, schools, and the society—early on children are taught what it means to be a boy or girl through day-to-day distribution of tasks, which get confirmed through childhood into adolescence. Expectations, praises, and role-models from classroom teachers are also often cited as social factors contributing to the differences.


These arguments are used to asserted that one group is better than the other in some subjects (Math and science for boys and reading for girls).






TIMSS 2015 (8<sup>th</sup> Grade) Science Achievement between boys and girls in Saudi Arabia






8<sup>th</sup> grade predictive margins of Math achievement by sex and subject value Predictive Margins of Students Achievement in Math by Sex and Subject Value




8<sup>th</sup> grade Predictive margins of science achievement by sex and subject value Predictive Margins of Students Achievement in Science by Sex and Subject Value




